They reside outside the City of Viroqua limits. If you live in a township, you are a non-resident.

Due to the fact that the boundaries of the City and School district are different, any person residing outside corporate boundaries of the City of Viroqua is considered a non-resident and will be charged a non-resident fee.

Golf

This program will provide instruction to improve on the fundamentals and enjoyment of golf. Instruction will work on pre-swing skills such as grip, aim, and posture. ADVANCED: This is a skill development class for players who are already comfortable with the basic shots of tennis, and who can play matches. Emphasis on skill-refinement and strategy through drills and match play will be the focus.
